8.1 Fund Request: Kombucha Jars

Thanks to everyone that has filled out the survey. I calculated that we would need tremendous amount of kombucha per day if that survey (27 people) was representative of the house. Instead, I think we should start a little smaller and see how it goes. According to the survey, 70 persons would want to drink kombucha everyday, with an average of 1,5 glass a day. Roughly, that would be 7 gallons of kombucha A FUCKING DAY. Instead, I am suggesting that we buy 7 jars of two gallons (it's already a fair amount) to start brewing and have 2 gallons of brewed kombucha everyday and see how it goes and if people actually drink it! So now, you are probably wondering WHY do we need new jars etc, since we probably have that already. Good question Sherlock. Basically, kombucha is brewed thanks to the beautiful work of a yeast (sexy huh), called a scoby. When brewing, the scoby remains on the top of the tea it is brewing. Touching it, and moving it to pour out the tea of the jar is complicated and you also take the risk of killing the scoby since it is a quite sensitive thing. The jars I have just found have a plastic spigot, which would allow us to pour out the ready brewed kombucha out of the jars and start a new batch without moving too much the scobies. It would diminish the risk of killing or damaging the scoby. Also, for future generations, it can always be used for other things and other liquids. I am asking for \$214.27 for 7 jars on amazon.com. \$30.61 per jar of 2 gallons
